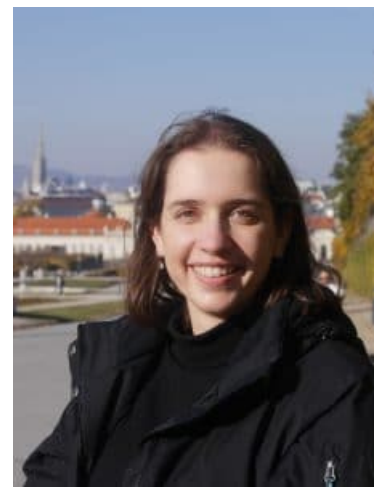

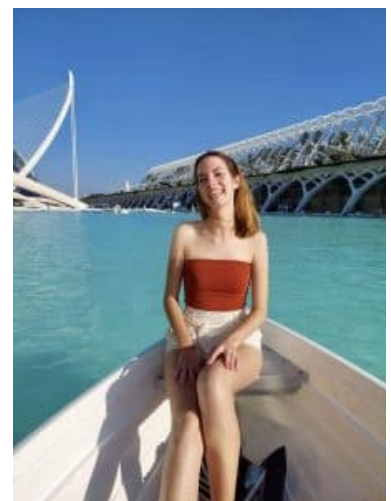
- Changes in the board

## Mini SPOT Nijmegen

Minispot Nijmegen attended the ENOTHE Annual Meeting in recent months and gained different networks from many parts of Europe. They are also currently in the process of forming a board to actively organize events. Their vision for this year is to create a nice and friendly environment where their students can chat and do activities about internationalization.

## Mini SPOT Hacettepe

In the past months, they organized meetings with occupational therapists who are experts in their fields, where they shared their experiences abroad, and also held a meeting where they received information about Erasmus.

They organized various events and meetings to raise awareness about occupational therapy and held a book raffle and competition on October 27, as every year. They also continued to organize speaking clubs.

Now they are working to initiate pen pal activity and to ensure the continuity of meetings with occupational therapists to discuss their experiences abroad.

In these months we hosted SPOTinars and already planning for news ones:

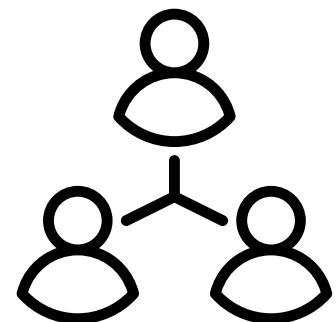

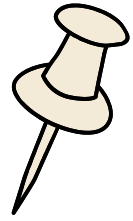
- ENOTHE Annual Meeting

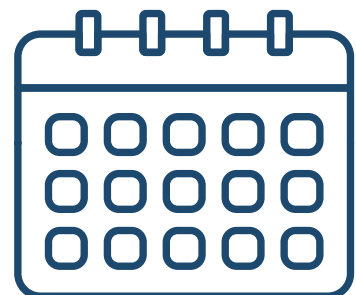
